To Whom It May Concern:

I would like to have my membership to my local (KEA), state (WEA) and national (NEA) unions cancelled as soon as possible.

The reason for this, after some thirty-eight years of faithful membership, is that I cannot in good conscience send funds to organizations that are undermining values I have long held and still cherish. I believe in the vision of racial justice espoused by MLK where we judge others by the content of their character and not the color of their skin.

Black Lives Matter and Critical Race Theory are doing just the opposite. Both of these movements are divisive and dangerous in my opinion, and have a definite Marxist flavor to them.
